The issue of elected versus appointed superintendents has returned although it has died in years past (HB0902, HB0184 and HB1607). A couple of bills aimed at modifying tenure for teachers have been introduced (HB2012 and HB1388), including one from the Governor which extends the probationary period from three years to five and requires a high level of performance from teachers before they are granted tenure. Finally a bill has been introduced that will impact Higher Education (HB 0796 and SB 1877).
